Home Learning Ideas

1. How do you recycle at home and school? Record how you recycle by making a poster, you could include writing, photos or drawing.
2. Draw the animals and plants you spot in a garden or at the park over a week.
3. If you have a favourite place to visit like a harbour, zoo, park, castle, beach can you share what makes it your favourite by taking photos of you enjoying it and write why it's special.
4. Using your recycling can you design a junk model of a robot that could take the plastic rubbish out of the seas and oceans?
5. Go to the local library and find some lovely books about the environment, such as ['The Great Paper Caper'](#) by Oliver Jeffers, ['Superfrog and the Big Stink'](#) by Michael Foreman, and ['Topsy and Tim Go Green'](#) by Jean and Gareth Adamson.
6. Be a gardener! Challenge yourself to grow and look after a plant. You could record what you do through a diary. Cress is quick to grow at home from seeds and tastes great in an egg mayo sandwich! :)
7. Create a fact file about your favourite animals and the habitats you find them.
8. Create a fact file about your favourite plants and the habitats you find them.
9. Trees are amazing, can you make a poster to tell others why they are so special and how we can look after them?
10. What makes the British Isles unique? What animals and plants are native to the UK? Create some art to show your favourite parts of our environment.
