



Speech and Language Therapy at Bromstone School

Screening and Supporting your Child's Speech and Language Development

We employ an independent Speech and Language Therapist for one and a half days per week. Her main focus is Reception children, but she does also support other children throughout the school who have a Speech Language and Communication Need (SLCN).

Here at Bromstone, all children in Reception are screened using an online tool called 'Language Link' which looks for gaps in the child's **understanding of language**. The areas looked at are:

- Concepts
- Verb tenses
- Instructions
- Pronouns
- Negatives
- Questions
- Verbal Reasoning
- Association

Talk Boost is a small group intervention (up to 4 children) that happens 3 times a week, for 10 weeks and is run by a trained Teaching Assistant. This small group work is then followed up by your child's Class Teacher who runs a whole class activity once a week. School-based Speech and Language Therapist (Jo) oversees the group and takes pre- and post-intervention information using a tracker.

Each session includes activities that cover the key elements of language:

- Attention and listening
- Vocabulary

- Building sentences
- Telling stories
- Conversations

Each week your child will bring home an activity sheet that you can complete together. The support from home really helps the children to progress in the sessions.

If parents or school staff are worried about a child's **pronunciation**, then the **Speech Link** screen can also be completed as part of the initial screen
