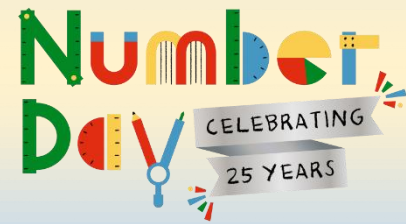
Lastly, we want to thank all the parents who joined us at The O2 to cheer on their children. Your support means a lot to us, and it made the experience even more special for the choir members.
