

Our Big Question for this term is:
“What happens when there is conflict?”



To introduce our Term 5 question “What happens when there is conflict? ” the whole school made a dove of peace to hang as part of an art installation. Some classes also included positive affirmations on their doves, linked to peace. The doves are presently hanging in the windows of the school library, as inspired by a similar display at Wells Cathedral.



Year 1 enjoyed a trip to Quex Farm last term. They went for a tractor ride around the farm and spent time looking at different farm animals and learning about how to care for them. The children even got a chance to feed the goats!
