Extra-curricular after school clubs start week commencing Monday 8th September.



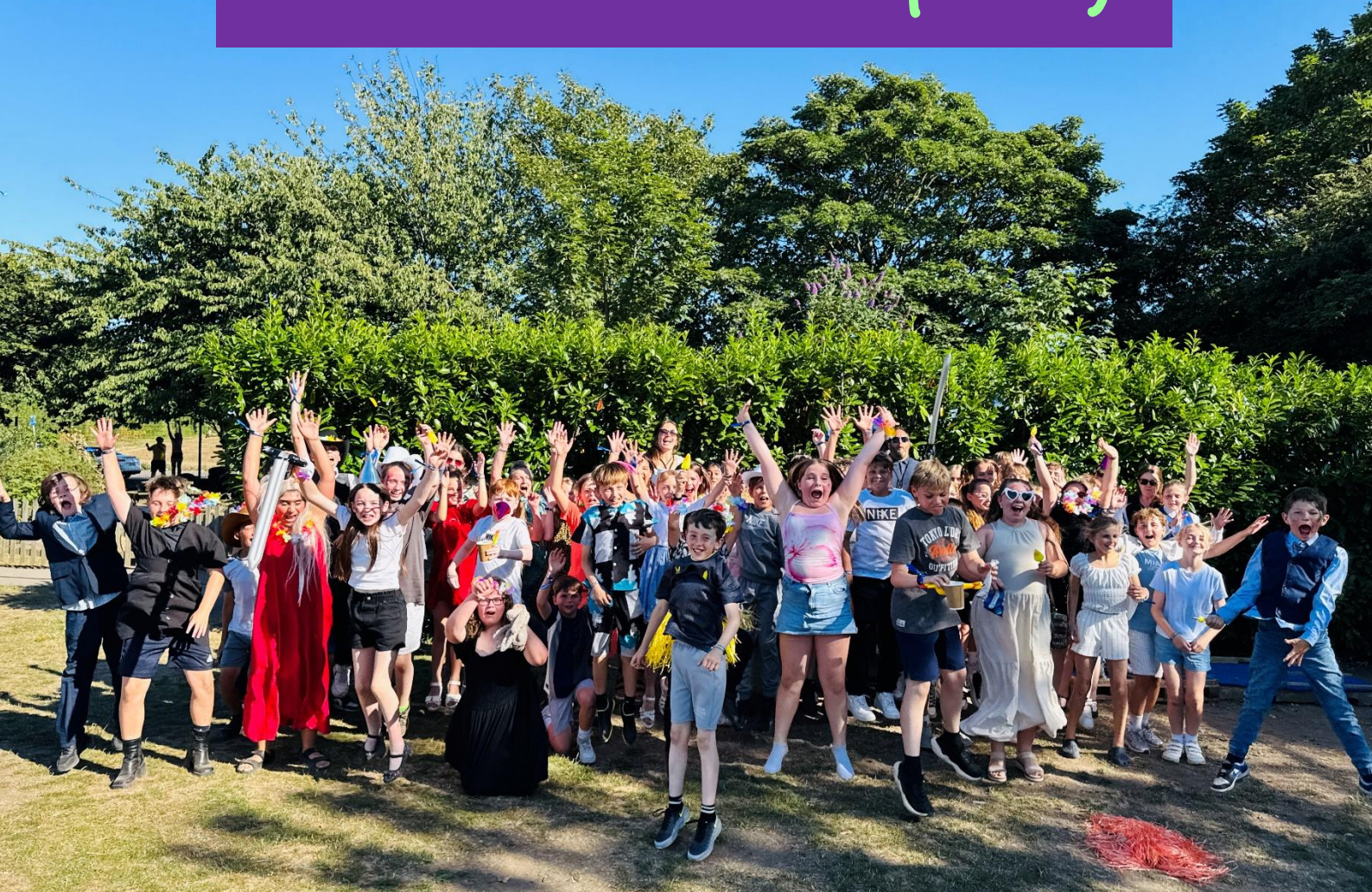

Children can take part by signing up at any Kent library or mobile library, where they'll receive a special folder to track their reading and earn rewards along the way – including stickers, a bookmark, seeds, a medal and certificate for reading six books!

There's also an online option, where children can set their own goals and unlock digital rewards. Everyone who completes the challenge can enter a prize draw to win an iPad or book tokens.
