Covid Updates

Children and young people aged 18 years and under who have a positive test result

It is not recommended that children and young people are tested for COVID-19 unless directed to by a health professional.

If a child or young person has a positive COVID-19 test result they should stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test, if they can. After 3 days, if they feel well and do not have a high temperature, the risk of passing the infection on to others is much lower. This is because children and young people tend to be infectious to other people for less time than adults.

Children and young people who usually go to school, college or childcare, and who live with someone who has a positive COVID-19 test result, should continue to attend as normal.

A few reminders for everyone

Lots of children are bringing bikes and scooters to school which is great, and something that we fully support. please can you ensure that your child has dismounted their scooter or bike before entering the gates.

Please note that dogs are not allowed on our site, this includes in the parents' waiting area. It is acceptable, if you have a very small dog, to carry your dog whilst you are collecting your child.
