




As you probably know the government have recently updated their Covid 19 guidance regarding the wearing of face masks from 27<sup>th</sup> January. We will continue to wear masks at the gates when we welcome you and within our communal areas in the school building as the number of cases in Bromstone are still on the rise.

This is the latest guidance regarding Covid-19. It now states that when children and adults test negative using a lateral flow test on day 5 and day 6 (24 hours apart) they can return to school on day 6. You can continue to try to produce two negative lateral flow tests up until day 9. If you are still testing positive on day 9, you must stop testing and complete the full 10 days isolation and return on day 11. (Day 0 is the first day of symptoms or your positive lateral flow test outcome).

Please see below a letter from the Senior Housing Officer at Thanet District Council regarding some funding that has been given to Thanet District Council from Contain Outbreak Management Fund (COMF). This money is to support households who are at risk of losing their homes.

#### Dear families,

The criteria stipulates that households who have been adversely financially affected as a result of the pandemic are prioritised.

The funding will enable Thanet District Council to:

- Boost the support for private rented sector tenants to financially recover from impact of the pandemic and prevent them losing their homes
- Support landlords in recovering from the loss of rental payments received where the tenants have fallen into rent arrears
- Support the containment of COVID-19 outbreaks by supporting households to remain in their
  existing homes and prevent households from becoming street homeless, or resulting in insecure and
  transient housing arrangements
- Provide support to homeowners who may be at risk of having their homes repossessed as a result of COVID-19

Thanet District Council will provide financial support for tenants in privately rented accommodation to recover from the financial impact of the pandemic and prevent them losing their homes, and will help landlords to recover from the loss of rental payments received where the tenants have fallen into rent arrears.

We will also provide financial support to homeowners who may be struggling to pay their mortgages as a result of COVID-19.
