Important Notice for Parents

Important Information regarding the computer game Grand Theft Auto - GTA

If we told you your child was playing a game in the playground that centred around gang violence, nudity, bad language, and drug and alcohol abuse, what would you think? In GTA this is exactly what is happening and children who play these games are being influenced by it. Players are hardened criminals, players kill not only fellow gangsters but also police officers and innocent civilians using both weapons and vehicles while conducting premeditated crimes, including a particularly disturbing scene involving torture. Women are frequently depicted as sexual objects, with a strip club mini-

game allowing players to fondle dancers' bodies, which are nude from the waist up. Players also have the opportunity to make characters use marijuana and drink alcohol, both of which then impact their perception of the world. All of the main characters are criminals who think of themselves first and others rarely at all. Virtually no characters here could be considered appropriate role models. Online modes allow players to create their own avatar and embark on a criminal career that includes armed robberies, corruption, and murder. Few games are more clearly targeted to an adult audience but yet we have knowledge of children from aged 5 and up playing or being exposed to this game. It is inappropriate and it will affect those children who are playing or watching it being played.

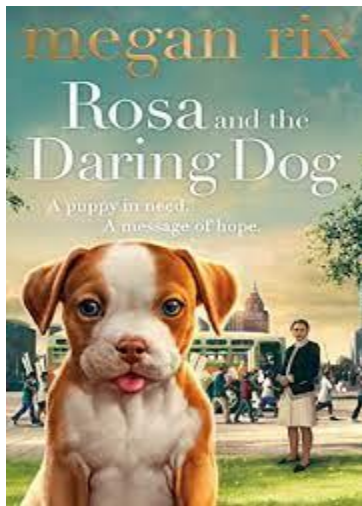
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Upcoming Events
