

Next week, on Wednesday 29th November, we are taking part in **NO PENS DAY**. Each child will need to bring in an object from home that they are happy to talk about with their class.

Why are we taking part in 'No Pens Day 2023: Show and tell'? Teachers estimate that, in the UK today, 1.9 million children struggle with talking and understanding words. Without the right support, they face huge hurdles in learning, making friends and staying in good mental health. It's a chance for your child to improve their speech, language and communication skills through a day of talking and listening activities – starting with the biggest ever show and tell!

Help your child take part by...Helping them choose something that they would like to bring in or talk about for show and tell. This could be: An object from home that they love, an item of clothing, a photograph of a person who they want to talk about, a photograph of a special memory or something imaginary! They don't have to bring anything in – they could just think of something they want to talk about.
