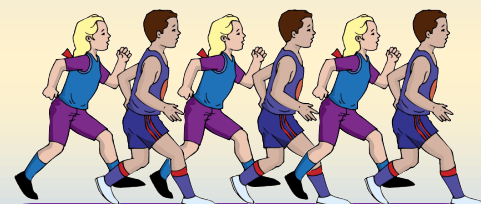
Other news

Some of the children were treated to a trip to the cinema this week. They all had a great time.

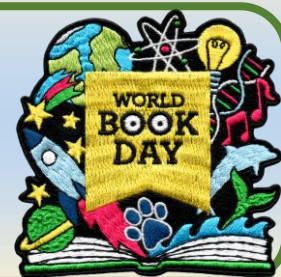
We are looking forward to more trips next term.

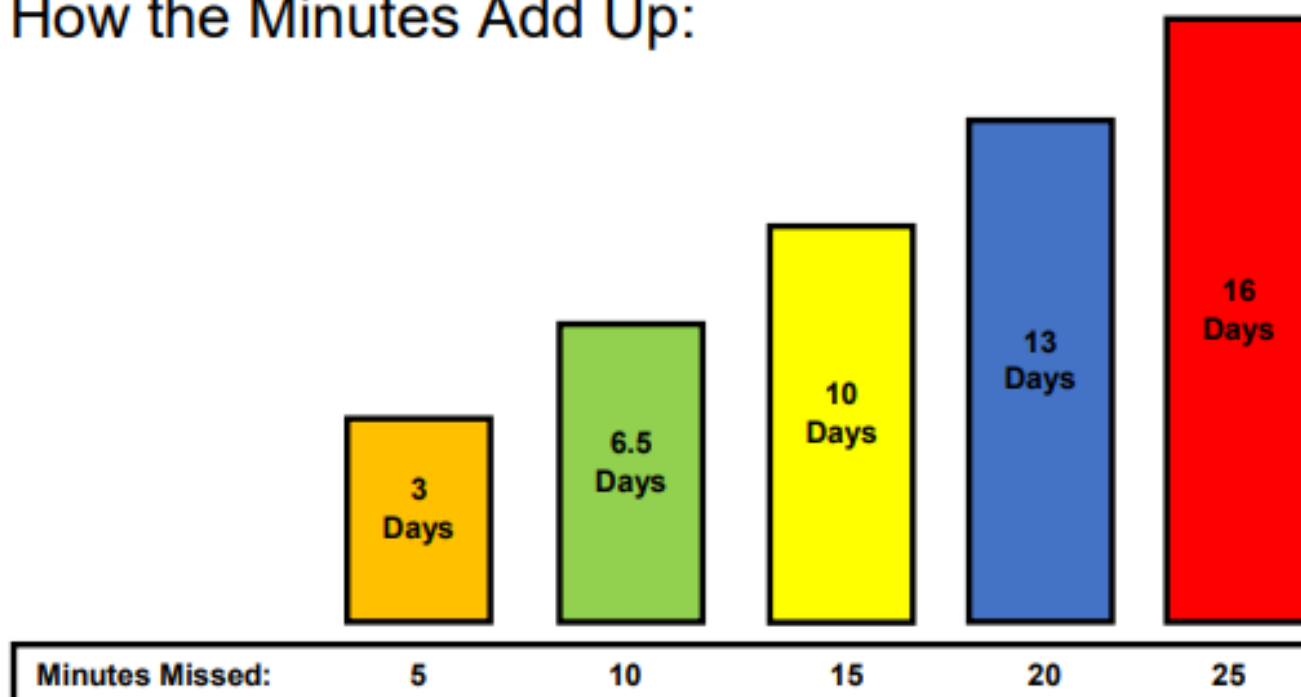
